#### **Rec Pickelball Etiquette**

- 1. When retrieving a ball from an adjacent court, don't just hit the ball back into their court without looking. That's very annoying!
- 2. Don't play "keep away" from the best player on the other team during rec play just so you can win they want to play too!
- 3. Don't cross the court behind a match until play has stopped. It's not only rude, but dangerous.
- 4. If you are asked to play with a group that is of a lower skill level than you, graciously accept and play a game with them. They will appreciate your graciousness and likely learn some too.
- 5. If you are one of the strongest people in your foursome, tone down the competitiveness and hit your opponent's balls that they can return. Work on a new skill – perhaps it's a great time for work on that third shot drop shot.
- If you and your partner can't determine if the ball was in or out – or if you disagree with your partner on a line call – the benefit of the doubt goes to your opponent. <u>That's an "official" rule!</u>
- Play a strategic dinking game occasionally and remember the ball does not always have to be smashed.
- 8. In rec play, don't exploit someone's physical limitations just so you can "win." Not cool!
- 9. Call out the score loudly before you serve.
- 10. Meet at the net after the game. Use your paddle face or paddle stick and say thanks for the game.
- 11. Wait until everyone is ready before you serve.
- 12. If a ball gets caught in your side of the net, but it needs to go to your opponent, don't weakly throw the ball back over. Make sure it reaches your opponent.
- 13. Congratulate people who make good shots.
- 14. Don't give people a lesson on the court. Unless they want one of course. Generally, in recreational play people do not want to always be corrected.
- 15. Watch out for outbursts. It's supposed to be fun!
